letter highlights many of the same issues and challenges that OAR faces today. For example, the newsletter highlights:

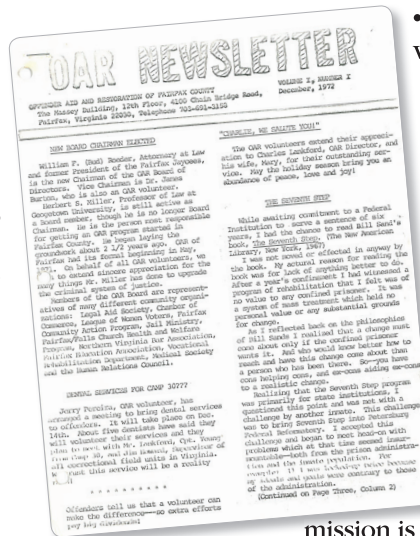
- Success with jail programs

### FY 2011 Key Accomplishments

- 3820 clients served
- 162 volunteers provided over 8620 hours of service
- 1014 people attended skills classes
- 21 unique skills classes (i.e. Employability Skills, Fatherhood, and Impact of Crime) were provided to meet the needs of the population served
- 392 clients were provided with employment related services during incarceration and after release
- 139 post release clients obtained employment through the Work Empowerment Program
- 879 clients were placed in community service saving \$645,670 in deferred incarceration costs and offering \$483,450 worth of service to the community
- 171 people enrolled in the Violence Intervention Program
- 1258 families were assisted by outreach and/or support groups
- Services were provided at 14 community sites to ensure client access to services

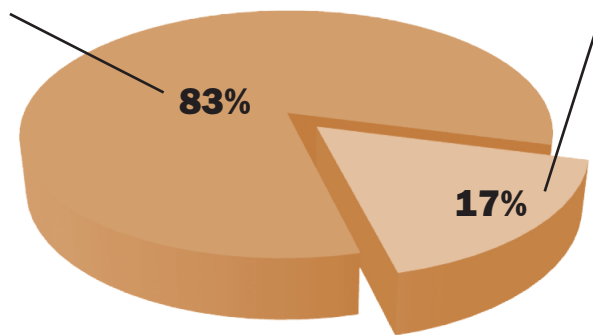
**Statement of Tax Exempt Status**
